Surrey, BC – The Sundar Prize Film Festival is proud to unveil a powerful lineup of queer films for its second annual edition, amplifying diverse voices and lived experiences from across the globe. With a mission to foster social impact through cinema, this year's theme, Life in Motion: Journeys of Growth and Discovery, is reflected in an exceptional selection of queer films that explore identity, love, resilience, and transformation.

Through film, we build bridges between communities, and offer hope to those still searching for acceptance.”

The 2025 Sundar Prize Film Festival will run from April 9 to 13 at the VIFF Centre, SFU Surrey Campus, and Landmark Cinemas Surrey, Guildford, featuring in-person screenings. Featured Queer Films in the 2025 Sundar Prize Film Festival:

Jia (Australia, 2024, 15 min, Dir. Vee Shi) – BC Premiere

Logline: Ming, a grieving Chinese mother, arrives in Australia to embark on a road trip with a young Caucasian man, Eric, to remember her late son. But she soon discovers that Eric was in a romantic relationship with her son, which clashes with her conservative values.

My Roommate Ahriman (British Columbia, 2023, 17 min, Dir. Nessa Aref) – Surrey Premiere

Logline: A young Iranian-Canadian man comes to terms with his sexuality and contends with the disconnection from his culture while inadvertently cohabitating with an ancient Persian Spirit of Chaos. [Assets](#)

Bulletproof: A Lesbian's Guide to Surviving the Plot (Canada, 2024, 105 min, Dir. Regan Latimer) – Surrey Premiere

Logline: In *Bulletproof: A Lesbian's Guide to Surviving the Plot*, filmmaker Regan Latimer takes an insightful, funny, and personal look at queer representation on television and media's power to shape how we see ourselves. With pop culture references and original animation, the film journeys across North America in a quest to understand the forces that influence LGBTQ+ stories on screen. [Assets](#).

A Simple Ask (United States, 2024, 9 min, Dir. Nadya Naumaan)

Logline: Nida, a young Muslim struggling with unspoken feelings, takes to the forest to seek guidance from Allah about their secret crush. Unintentionally summoning a fearsome ancestor, Nida is met with an unconventional yet strangely fitting push toward self-acceptance. [Assets](#).

Body Varial (British Columbia, 2024, 15 min, Dir. Audrey Kerridge) – Surrey Premiere

Logline: After recently undergoing top surgery, a transmasculine skateboarder attempts to reintegrate themselves back into daily life. Throughout their recovery, they discover newfound struggles both physically and mentally in life post-operation. [Assets](#).

Canyon Chorus (United States, 2023, 17 min, Dir. Chris Cresci) – BC Premiere

Logline: Set against the backdrop of Desolation Canyon, LGBTQ+ advocate and world-record traveler Mikah Meyer reflects with close friends and his mentor, Larry Edwards, on the power of mentorship within the queer community.

Leilani's Fortune (Canada, 2023, 80 min, Dir. Loveleen Kaur) – Surrey Premiere

Logline: An intimate documentary following the blossoming career of queer, Ethiopian-Eritrean

artist Witch Prophet. After a decade of struggling as an independent artist, she is finally receiving the validation and support she needs to create the album of her prophecies.
